A Musical Genius

For many people Ludwig van Beethoven (1770-1827) is the most (1) (INFLUENCE) figure in the history of western classical music. The young Beethoven's ability won him the admiration of the leading contemporary musical figures. Throughout the 1790s he worked hard to secure the interest of wealthy patrons. Whatever his awe-inspiring musical (6)(ACHIEVE), however, his personal life was something of a disaster. His day-to-day (7) (RELATE) with people (8) (VARIABLE) turned out to be rather turbulent. Although he apparently fell in love with a number of society women, the identity of the girl who lay closest to his heart remains (9)(ELUDE) to this day.
